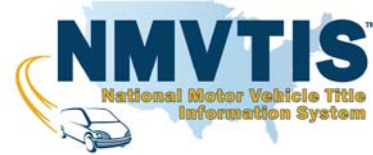

**Reporting by Auto Recyclers, Junk yards, Salvages and Insurers to
National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS)**

*As required by 28 CFR Part 25 NMVTIS Final Rule
- published January 30, 2009*

Background:

The Anti-Car Theft Act and the NMVTIS Final Rule requires that the reporting entities; auto recyclers, junk and salvage yards and insurance carriers, must report information on automobiles that have been designated junk, salvages (including those determined to be a total loss). In order to support this requirement the system operator, American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators (AAMVA) must establish the procedures and mechanism for this information to be reported to NMVTIS. In addition, the recent Federal District Court Ruling requires that this mechanism must be in place and reporting to begin **by March 31, 2009.**

Data Requirements:

The specific data to be reported under the Final Rule – is captured in attachment A. Please note that the technical specification for data consolidators will includes these elements along with other data needed to administer the reporting mechanism.

Data Consolidators:

In an effort to reduce the cost burden and allow for a more efficient process, AAMVA will be utilizing the services of third party organizations.

- The relationship between the data consolidator and the reporting entity is a matter between the parties that should be governed by some level of agreement. The system operator has established a technical specification for the data that is to be reported by the consolidator; this includes all of the required data for each type of reporting entity (e.g. auto recycler, junk yard, insurer, salvage pool, shredder, etc.) as outlined in the Final Rule
- Each data consolidator will enter into a formal agreement with the system operator that outlines the terms, conditions and service levels of the relationship.

Reporting entities:

The reporting entities are those auto recyclers' junk yards, salvage yards and insurers as defined in the Final Rule.

- Reporting entities will have the option of using several organizations that the system operator designates as an authorized "Data Consolidator". These Data Consolidators will provide a collection and transmission function to all entities that are required to report to NMVTIS.
- Reporting entities can select whichever data consolidator that best serves their interests.
- All reporting entities using a data consolidator will be assigned a unique identification number that must be used in reporting data to NMVTIS. This number will be used to monitor and report on reporting entities compliances with the requirement to report to NMVTIS.
