DHS Extends Digital Driver's License and Identification Card Comment Deadline

The United States Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has [extended](#) the comment deadline of its recent [request for information](#) (RFI) soliciting comments to inform a rulemaking that would amend DHS regulations to set the minimum technical requirements and security standards for mobile or digital driver's licenses and identification cards to enable federal agencies to accept those credentials for official purposes under the REAL ID Act and regulation. The comment period for the RFI is now extended from June 18, 2021 to **July 30, 2021**.

AAMVA encourages members that are submitting comments to the docket to provide a copy to governmentaffairs@aamva.org so that those comments may be reflected in our own.

In conjunction with the extension of the comment deadline, DHS also announced that in advance of the closing date for comments submitted in response to the RFI, DHS will hold a virtual public meeting on June 30, 2021, to answer questions regarding the RFI and to provide an additional forum for comments by stakeholders and other interested persons regarding the issues identified in the RFI. The virtual public meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 30, 2021, from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm (EDT). [Requests to attend the meeting](#) and request for accommodations for a disability must be received by **June 25, 2021**.
