Reporting the VINs of all salvage and total loss vehicles to NMVTIS prevents fraud and theft and can protect families from unsafe vehicles.

**You can make a difference.**

**Federal law requires** that any business or individual handling five or more junk, salvage or insurance (total loss) vehicles annually, must submit the required monthly reports to the National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS) through a third party reporting service. Reporting can be as frequent as desired, but not less frequent than monthly. The Department of Justice (DOJ) encourages submission of information to NMVTIS as soon as possible to prevent fraud and theft and to protect consumers.

### How To Report Information to NMVTIS

Any business or individual handling five or more junk, salvage or insurance (total loss) vehicles annually must report vehicle information to NMVTIS through authorized third party data consolidators. A list of these consolidators and reporting requirements is available at [https://www.vehiclehistory.gov/nmvtis\\_auto.html](https://www.vehiclehistory.gov/nmvtis_auto.html). Some data consolidators may establish limited service charges in order to provide improved or additional services to reporting entities.



Failure to report to NMVTIS is punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000 per reporting violation.
