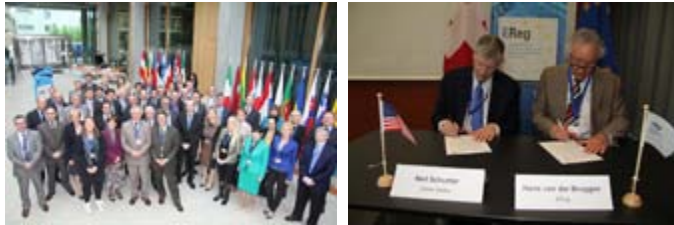


## AAMVA's This Week in Review for June 10, 2013

## Document Security Alliance holds Capitol Hill Event and Meeting

Chairman and Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission Ray Martinez and AAMVA's Director of Identity Management Geoff Slagle were panelists at a special event hosted by Senator Kirk that was geared at better understanding the national security threat fraudulent documents pose -- especially counterfeit DL/IDs. Commissioner Martinez was also a key note speaker at the U.S. Secret Service for the second meeting of 2013 for the Document Security Alliance. He was joined by his Director of Security & Investigations, Tom Flarity -- they both presented on New Jersey's efforts to address the implementation of facial recognition and what their experiences were proving as well as shedding light on ways to collaborate with other entities that may have been defrauded by the same individuals that are being caught as a result of the "scrub".
