DLDV Provides Commercial Partners and Government Agencies with Real-time Capability to Verify DL/ID Credentials with Data from the Issuing Jurisdiction

DLDV aims to meet AAMVA member goals

Curb identity theft

Prevent documentation fraud

Protect integrity of credentials issued by the Jurisdictions

Develop alternative revenue streams

DLDV targets three goals from the AAMVA Strategic Plan

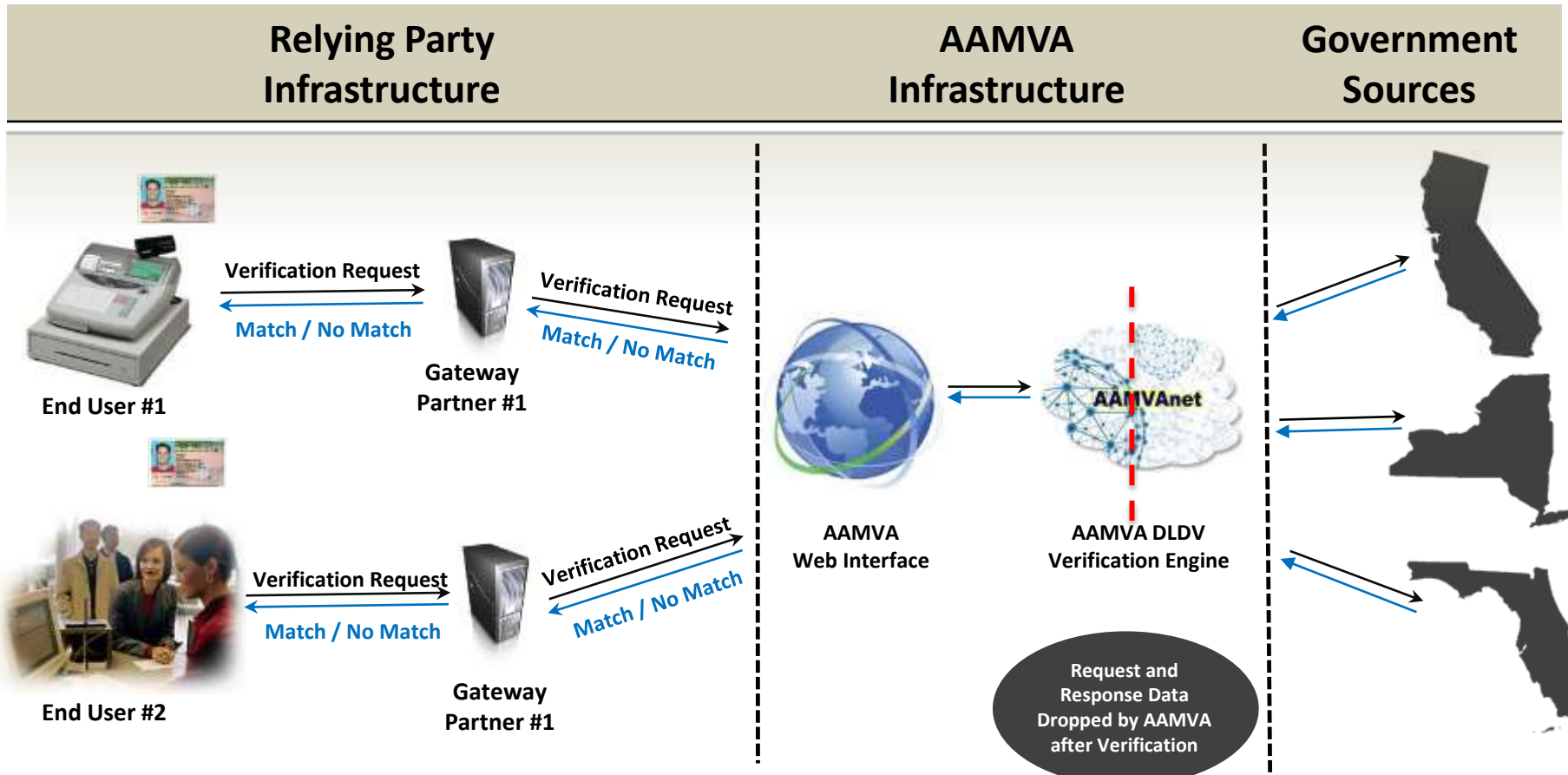

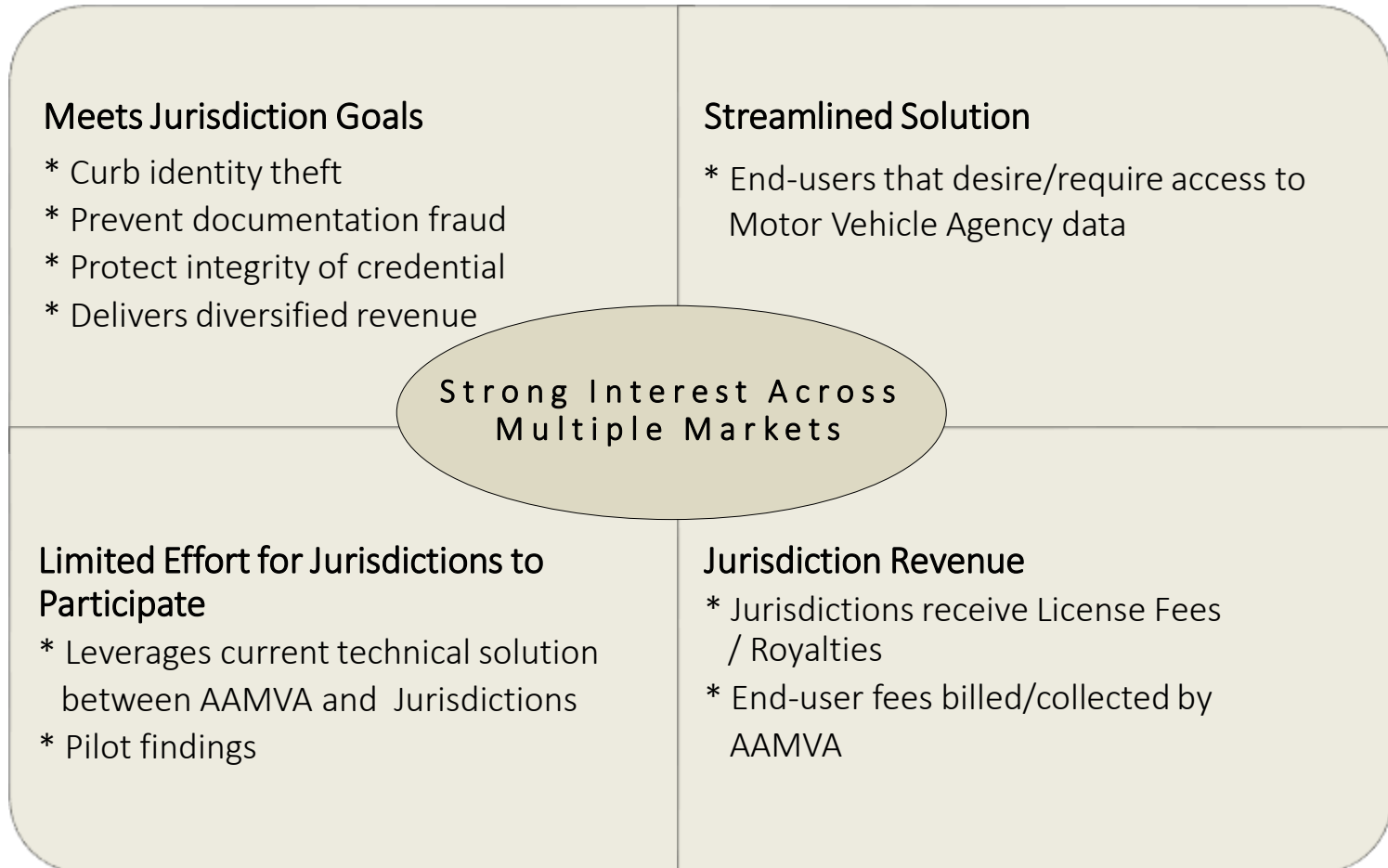
Why DLDV for the MVA?

- MVA's play a primary role in identity management
- The driver's license has evolved from an indication of driving privilege to an identity document
- Verification is a natural evolution of an MVA's core role of establishing and protecting identities
- Providing verification services adds integrity and security, and a more valuable service to citizens
- As an identity document, the DL/ID card protects the holders and relying parties
- Value in a joint commitment by the jurisdictions, and AAMVA developing a national solution
- That value and commitment offers the ability to open new sources of revenue
 - Relying parties will pay reasonable fees to avoid the larger cost of identity fraud or risk exposure
- *"The [state] Department of Motor Vehicles is committed to protecting the identity of its customers and the integrity of the documents it issues."*
- *"The Division of Motor Vehicles is striving to take every precaution to prevent Identity Theft."*
- MVA websites contain information regarding actions for citizens who suspect their identity has been compromised – prevention through DLDV provides additional service
- Ease of DLDV implementation

- Participating Jurisdictions
 - 18 Jurisdictions; 48% coverage
 - Fully Operational
 - Service Agreement and Implementation complete
 - Implemented
 - Service Agreement in progress and Implementation complete
 - Plan to Participate
 - Service Agreement and/or Implementation in progress
- Participation Under Review
 - 14 Jurisdictions; 16% coverage
- Participation at Future Date
 - 19 Jurisdictions; 36% coverage
