CDL Examiner Update Class Announcement

AAMVA will be conducting two Commercial Driver License (CDL) Examiner Update Classes the week of November 17, 2014 at the Pinellas Technical Education Center (PTEC) in St. Petersburg, Florida. The class size is limited to 14 persons and will be held as follows:

- Class 1:** Monday, November 17th thru Wednesday, November 19th
- Class 2:** Thursday, November 20th thru Saturday, November 22nd

The class is designed to be a hands-on training class for experienced CDL Examiners or trainers. The class will focus on CDL & CLP issuance, CDL Classification/Endorsements & Restrictions, CDL Knowledge & Skills Testing, Examiner Training Requirements, Background Record Checks and Certification as required by the Commercial Driver's License Testing and Commercial Learner's Permit Standards final rule. There is no tuition or registration fee for this training. All travel, room and board expenses will be

paid by AAMVA. **Nominees must have a thorough knowledge of the CDL program and current experience conducting CDL Skills Tests.** *Staff nominations from Jurisdictions that have not implemented the 2005 CDL Testing System as of July 31, 2014 will be given priority. All other nominations will be considered based upon submission date and time if space allows.*

AAMVA Releases 'Design Principles and Guidelines for Secure DL/ID Cards (SCDP)'



Imagine investing time, money, energy, and resources into a new secure document and then realizing that you did not get out of it what you would hope to. This is one of the challenges that face issuing authorities when it comes to designing a new driver license or identification card. The reality is that it is possible to be in compliance with the AAMVA Driver License/Identification (DL/ID) standard and yet still not achieve an optimal outcome in the effectiveness of your card's design. The [Secure Card Design Principles \(SCDP\) whitepaper](#) is intended to lay out a set of principles, guidelines, and practices that can maximize the probability of developing and maintaining a DL/ID that will be resistant to compromise. U.S. Department of Transportation Unveils New, Free, Online Search Tool for Recalls Using Vehicle Identification Number

Every year, millions of vehicles are recalled in the United States due to safety defects or noncompliance with federal safety standards. To help car buyers, owners and renters know that their vehicles are safe and their safety defects have been address, the U.S. Department of Transportation's National

Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) has unveiled a new, free, online search tool consumers can use to find out if a vehicle is directly impacted by a recall. The new tool is available on www.safercar.gov/vinlookup and provides consumers with a quick and easy way to identify uncompleted recalls by entering their Vehicle Identification Number (VIN).
