Arlington, VA – The American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators (AAMVA) congratulated Mike Dixon, outgoing Chair of its International Board of Directors, for his dedication and service during the past year. Dixon serves as Senior Director, Division of Motor Vehicles, at the Colorado Department of Revenue.

During his tenure as AAMVA Chair, Dixon oversaw the production of new resources for members addressing diverse areas including foreign driver's license reciprocity, reducing suspended drivers, and automated vehicles, and investments in member-focused services such as mDL guidelines and IT services modernization.

Mike Dixon has been the Senior Director for the Division of Motor Vehicles in the Colorado Department of Revenue since July 1, 2011. Colorado's DMV provides its residents with driver and vehicle services as well as providing operational support to 64 counties for vehicle services. Dixon was the Executive Sponsor for the Colorado DRIVES project which replaced decade's old DMV IT systems for driver and vehicle services; and today he's leading the DMV's expansion of online services. Previously he served as the President for AAMVA Region 4.

Prior to joining the Colorado DMV, Mike served in the United States Army for over 28 years with assignments throughout the United States and worldwide including Korea, Europe and Southwest Asia. He served as a commander for two Army Aviation companies, a battalion as well as the 1st Aviation Brigade. Mike also held key staff positions in organizations from Battalion to Army level in the United States and overseas. Mike retired as a colonel in 2010.

Founded in 1933, AAMVA serves North American motor vehicle and law enforcement agencies to accomplish their missions.
